(*Negotiating Mandate stage*) Report of the Budget Committee on the Division of Revenue Amendment Bill [B 13–2024] (NCOP), dated 27 November 2024, as follows:

The Budget Committee, having considered the subject of the Division of Revenue Amendment Bill [B 13–2024] (NCOP), referred to it in accordance with Standing Rule 217, confers on the Western Cape's delegation in the NCOP the authority to not support the Bill, with recommendations included below.

The reasons for the Committee not supporting the Bill is summarised as follows:

Introduction and Overview

Since the tabling of DORA there was an increase of 17.035 billion to the national allocation, rising from R 1.434 trillion to R 1.451 trillion. It is important to note the following:

National and Provincial Allocations:

- The national share includes conditional allocations to provincial and local spheres, general fuel levy sharing with metros, debt servicing costs, the contingency reserve, and provincial allocations.
- 2. The provincial envelope remains the same, with the Provincial Allocation to all provinces remains at R 600.5 billion as of DORA 2024.
- In terms of provincial equitable share (PES), the 2024/25 PES for the Western Cape remains at R61.753 billion, whilst the Provincial Allocation to all provinces remains at R 600.5 billion as of DORA 2024.

Public Participation

The Western Cape Budget Committee (the Committee) placed adverts in the Burger (Afrikaans), Argus (English), Vukani (isiXhosa), advertised on Facebook, and on the WCPP website.

Local Government Allocations in the Western Cape:

 Local Governments in the Western Cape will receive R7.19 billion in grant allocation, which is a decrease of R650 million from R7.84 billion since the 2024/25 main budget. This translates to an 8.29% decrease. 2. Comparing the province to the total local government share, this means local government in the Western cape is allocated 7.1% of this total value.

Provincial Equitable Share

Revisions to the equitable share formula

For the 2025 MTEF, there are no proposed changes that are being made to any of the components of the formula resulting from the review of the PES formula.

The PES formula still does not take into account provision for Special Needs Education (Education), and Home-based care (Health).

According to the current design, Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal, consistently emerge as the top two recipients of the PES. Meanwhile, the Western Cape, which is the third most populous province, receives the fifth-largest allocation. The structure of the PES formula has remained static over time and reactive to the prevailing socio-economic conditions. The review of the PES formula will be completed with the implementation of the revised education component scheduled for the 2026 MTEF. This creates an opportunity to strengthen the PES formula and enhance its robustness to support positive outcomes.

The PES formula does not take into consideration future economic or population growth.

Since the PES formula will be phased in over 3 years, the funding from the formula will always be based on outdated information and the PES formula should be revised in order to be implemented immediately each financial year.

The combined impact of the new data updates in the PES formula phased in from 2025/26 of 2024 Medium-Term Expenditure Framework amounts to an adjustment of **R674.059 million over the 2025 period.** This will however be **phased in over 3 years,** meaning that the current funding for the 2024 data updates will only be received fully in the 2027/28 financial year.

Data availability

For the 2025 MTEF the following technical information should be noted:

Most of the components are updated with the most recent information available, with the exception of the Income and Expenditure Survey.

Technical updates to the PES formula

- Education: The education component has been updated using the school-age population (5 to 17 years) from the 2024 Mid-Year Population Estimates (MYPE) from Statistics South Africa, and the school enrolment data drawn from the Learner Unit Record Information and Tracking System (LURITS) data from the Department of Basic Education.
- **Health:** The health component has been updated with the 2022/23 and 2023/24 District Health Information Services patient load data from the Department of Health. The risk-adjusted subcomponents reflect changes in the health risk profile of medically uninsured individuals, including fertility rates and mortality data.
- Economic activity: The economic component has been updated with the 2023 regional GDP data. The formula previously used the 2019 regional GDP data while Statistics South Africa was conducting a review of the methodology used to determine the provincial GDP numbers. The review has been concluded and the economic activity component is updated with the numbers that were officially released following the review.

In addition to the above-mentioned updates, the rest of the components of the formula have been updated with the 2024 MYPE and the 2010/11 Income and Expenditure Survey.

The 2024 technical data updates will result in the Western Cape receiving additional -

- R65.2 million in the 2025/26 financial year;
- R252.4 million in the 2026/27 financial year; and
- R356.3 million in the 2027/28 financial year.

The Western Cape's PES will stand at 10.4 per cent of the total provincial portion nationally – marginally increasing over the 2025 Medium-Term Expenditure Framework.

Provincial Funding Envelope

National Treasury has indicated provincial envelopes of funding will remain the same, meaning that the budget is not increasing in line with service delivery demands and rapid population growth. The population of the Western Cape continues to grow, which inevitably increases the demand for provincial services.

While we welcome the data updates to the Provincial Equitable Share formula, a further implication of not increasing provincial envelopes mean that provinces are continuously fighting over the same envelope of funding, when instead the National Government needs to increase the provincial funding envelope in line with service delivery demands in provinces – particularly Health, Education and Social Development.

Between the **2021 and 2024 MTEF**, there has already been a **real budget cut** on the provincial equitable share of the Western Cape amounting to **R8.4 billion**, due to carry-through effect of fiscal consolidation over the period.

Conditional Grants

An additional R1.198 billion has been allocated to the Western Cape for disaster and infrastructure funding

The Western Cape government's applications for disaster and infrastructure funding from National Government has been approved and the Western Cape will be receiving **R1.198 billion** flowing through various provincial conditional grants, including –

- **R948 million** for disaster-related infrastructure reconstruction and rehabilitation of infrastructure damaged between December 2023 and July 2024; and
- **R251 million** for the Western Cape Rapid Schools Build Programme, which forms part of R2.5 billion approval for school infrastructure over the 2024 MTEF.

In particular, the disaster funding deals with funding already expended on previous disasters and does not increase the funding envelope for new infrastructure. In particular, the disaster-related funding will be allocated to the Comprehensive Agricultural Support Programme Grant, Education Infrastructure Grant (EIG), Health Facility Revitalisation Grant, and Provincial Roads Maintenance Grant (PRMG).

Recommendations for Amendments by the NCOP to the Division of Revenue Amendment Bill [B 13-2024] (NCOP)

The Western Cape does not support the Division of Revenue Amendment Bill for the following reasons and recommends:

- 1) The National Government did not fully fund the costs of the 2023 centrally agreed to public wage agreement to provinces, which in turn lead to a shortfall of R 1.1 billion rand.
- 2) It is recommended that the national government must fully fund all above CPI public sector wage increases to all provinces, particularly for frontline services (Health, Education and Social Development).
- 3) The carry-through effect of the 2021 and 2024 MTEF fiscal consolidation on provinces resulted in a R8.4 billion budget cut on the provincial equitable share of the Western Cape. The national government is thus forcing provincial governments to cut provincial budgets as the provincial budgets are not increasing at the same pace as service delivery demands and rapid population growth. It is recommended that National Government increases the provincial funding envelopes in order to fully accommodate service delivery demands faced in Health, Education and Social Development in provinces.
- 4) The Provincial Equitable Share (PES) to the Western Cape is not keeping up with population growth. The Western Cape remains the fastest growing province but fails to receive its fair share in line with these metrics. This places increased strain on our service delivery requirements. It is recommended that a comprehensive review be initiated by National Government to review the PES formula in order to have a heavier weight overall in the formula towards population growth.
- 5) A failure to perform adequate criminal intelligence from National has led to the province continually having dire crime statistics. **It is recommended** that a policing mandate be granted to the Western Cape, and that the respective funding must accompany it.
- 6) It is recommended that there be a comprehensive review of conditional grants to assess whether some of them can be phased into the provincial equitable share formula.
- 7) It is recommended that the National Treasury must confirm whether all social workers as a fully-fledged frontline service.

For these reasons, it is recommended that Western Cape does not support this Bill.

Minority View:

In terms of Standing Rule 90, the African Nation Congress and the Patriotic Alliance expressed their minority views to support the Bill.
