How many (a) rapes have been reported in the Mitchells Plain/Lentegeur precinct, (b) suspects have been (i) arrested for rape and (ii) charged with rape in the area, (c) suspects are (i) awaiting trial and (ii) on trial, and (d) suspects have been convicted of rape?

- (2) whether there are any signs or initiatives from the national government to specifically support emerging Western Cape farmers in the wine industry; if so, what are the relevant details?

(a) (i) What are the aims, (ii) the timeframes for development, (iii) the participating stakeholders and (iv) best practices that inform the development of this system and (b) how will the system support the work of non-profit organisations which offer food relief to vulnerable residents?

10. Mr M K Sayed to ask Ms D A Schäfer, Minister of Education:

- (1) Whether the decision by the municipalities to charge schools at business rates for water bills has been brought to her attention, if so, (a) what are the relevant details and (b) what is the impact of this decision on schools in the province;
- (2) (a) what is the amount that schools were charged for water bill under the domestic rates and (b) how much are they charged under business rates;
- (3) what is the detailed report of expenditure of all public ordinary schools on their water bills for (a) June 2020, (b) July 2020, (c) August 2020, (d) September 2020, (e) October 2020, (f) November 2020, (g) December 2020, (h) January 2021, (i) February 2021 and (j) March 2021?

- (3) whether applicants received different amounts of funding; if so, (a) what was the amount received by each, (b) what are the names of applicants who received funding, and (c) what are their arts or cultural status or classification?

According to the Provincial Procurement Reports, Masiqhame Trading 1057 supplied, inter alia, the following PPE: Plastic Aprons, Cloth Masks, Disposable Masks, Gloves and Sanitiser. The tender documents issued by the Western Cape Provincial

Government tenders for PPE has a mandatory section, which requires suppliers to Register with SAPHRA.

(a) Why was Masiqhame Trading 1057 exempted from being a SAPHRA licensed supplier, (b) what process was used to exempt Masiqhame Trading 1057 from being a licensed supplier, (c) what is the total procurement, in Rand value, of PPE medical devices as defined by SAPHRA from Masiqhame Trading 1057 and (d) what is the total procurement Rand value, by her Department, from March 2020 to date?

- (4) (a) how will the agency be funded, (b) how much will the government contribute,(c) when will the infrastructure agency be fully established and (d) what is the proposed institutional structure;
- (5) whether the infrastructure agency will have any relations with national and local spheres of government, if not, why not, if so, what are the relevant details?

16. Mr D Smith to ask Mr D J Maynier, Minister of Finance and Economic Opportunities:

Whether any municipalities in the province applied the MFMA SCM Regulation 32 in respect of procurement of goods and services under contracts secured by other organs of state in (a) 2019/20 and (b) 2020/21 financial years, if not, why not, if so, (a) what are the relevant details and (b) including (i) details of such municipalities, (ii) for which contracts, (iii) duration and (vi) value of such contracts?
